Dear Baby Buggy:

I would like to thank you for your charitable donation of the Graco Double Stroller. My client N.N. who received the stroller is a 25 year-old woman from Nigeria. She migrated to the United States in July of 2008 hoping for a better life. A few months after her arrival, she found out that she was pregnant with twins. At that time she and her husband were unemployed and faced financial hardships as recent immigrants. Queens Hospital Center referred N.N. to the Nurse-Family Partnership program and she was enrolled and became my client in December of 2008.

The Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) program is an effective, evidence-based home visiting program that has been found to improve the health and life course of low-income, first-time mothers, their children and their families. As a nurse for the NFP program, I provide bi-weekly home visits, beginning in pregnancy until the child's second birthday. Currently, N.N. is still unemployed and the family's financial situation remains precarious. My client is unable to obtain essential items for her babies. The Graco double stroller donated by Baby Buggy has greatly benefited this family. N.N. will be able to take the babies safely and comfortably to their doctors' appointments. She will also be able to travel with the babies to the grocery store, church, and to the park with the infants now that the weather is warmer; things she could not have done without the double stroller donation.

In essence, the Graco double stroller donation is a tremendous relief to N.N. She can now focus on maintaining her health and figuring out how to provide other needed essentials for her children. I would once again like to thank you for your continuous support to N.N. and to the hundreds of other NFP mother's across New York City.
